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Regulatory Framework

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Basic safety requirements of the GPSD

A product may only be made available on the market if it does not put the safety and health of persons at risk when used as intended or in foreseeable manner.

In order to assess whether a product complies with the requirement pursuant to sentence 1, the following aspects are to be taken into account in particular:

b the properties of the product, including its composition, packaging and instructions for assembly, installation, maintenance and useful life,

the impact of the product on other products, where it is reasonably foreseeable that it will be used together with other products,

the presentation of the product, its marking, any warnings, instructions for use and instructions for its disposal and any other product related data or information,

the groups of users that are exposed to greater risks than other groups.

To assess compliance with the requirements, harmonised, non-harmonised and national standards may be considered

Presumption of conformity if product complies with harmonised standards listed in the OJ

Further requirements of the GPSD

- Provide safety information and instructions for proper use

- Affix of name and complete postal contact address of the manufacturer or importer (based in the EU)

- Provision of complaint and recall management

- Provision to motify national market surveillance authorities if manufacturers, importers or retailers know to ought to know that the product poses a risk to health and safety (RAPEX risk medium or higher)



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Abstract safety requirements for consumer products (2)

Description Consumer groups exposed to risk when using the product, especially vulnerable consumers such as children, the elderly and people with disabilities;
Description Consumers are product, although not designed or suitable for children, is to be considered as attractive to or suitable for use by children;
Description Cybersecurity features necessary to protect the product from external influences

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New obligations for online marketplaces, Art. 20

• Online marketplaces are platforms that offer products from distributors based outside the EU and for which no economic operator is established in the EU. Online marketplaces are subject to new obligations:

• Central contact address for market surveillance authorities in the event of complaints

• Registration requirement for online marketplaces:

• Obligation to remove dangerous products from the marketplace within two working days of being requested to do so by the market surveillance authorities.

• Obligation to publish certain information and product warnings on the marketplace upon request by the market surveillance authorities

• Obligation to monitor the market and proactively block dangerous products

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New offical reporting obligations

Offical reporting obligations for consumer products:

➤ Current official reporting obligation to the competent market surveillance authorities

➤ Notification to the authorities if the economic operator knows or must know that a consumer product poses risks to the safety and health of persons.

➤ In practice: obligation to notify if RAPEX risk assessment results in a "medium risk" or higher

➤ In the future: Obligation to report accidents under the following conditions (Art. 19):


➤ The manufacturer has become aware of an accident caused by a consumer product placed on the European market. Importers and distributions must inform the manufacturer in the event of an accident.

➤ It is irrelevant whether the accident resulted in personal injury, what degree of contributory negligence the consumer has, or whether the consumer product poses a relevant risk as defined by RAPEX.





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
